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General Directions.

Use the muscular movement if you can. Have your pencil well sharpened, **make** your letters small as possible, this is conducive to high speed.

Spell altogether by sound. Do not write silent letters. Pronounce the word, and then write the sound actually heard.

Practice to write small, its the only practice you need to keep up for a while until it becomes natural for you.

To become a proficient stenographer it is necessary to possess a complete mastery of the principles of the system. The student is, therefore, urged to become thoroughly familiar with each lesson before proceeding to the following one.

Accuracy and neatness of writing should be the sole aim of the student until he reaches the point.

LESSON 4.

Words occur so frequently that it is desirable to represent them in the briefest way possible. Each alphabetic character can be employed to stand for one or more words of which it happens to be a prominent sound. These are designated from one-third to one half of the words found in any article of speech. They must be thoroughly committed to memory, until they can be repeated aloud with a degree of speed.

The stenographer will be able to make special abbreviations for words, names, terms or phrases frequently occurring in his own work.

For example, the law stenographer would adopt *pla* for "plaintiff," *def* for "defendant," *wit* for "witness," *wsyn* for "what is your name?" *wdura* for "where do you reside?" *hng liv yr* for "How long have you lived there?"

The words "of the" are omitted when they occur in a sentence—that is, when they occur between other words. The omission is indicated by writing the **Succeeding** word **close** to the word **preceding** "of the."

Examples.

Your letter of the 14th.

Written: *yl 14*

End of the season.

Written: *nd sez*

Top of the hill.

Written: *tp hl*

When "of the" are the **first** words in a sentence, they are written:

Example: "Of the many places I saw I prefer Oklahoma City."

Written: *oz ma pla i so pre Okla sty*

Punctuation

All the ordinary punctuation marks may be employed, except the period, to be represented with a stroke drawn across the line
 Viz: Your recent letter received. In the reply.

Written: *y ; sn l . s / ny . p /*

Use all the abbreviations for days of the week and months of the year. Names of every state in the United States.

Write not less than one half of names, towns or cities, persons or articles.

IMPORTANT NOTICE

In reading your shorthand notes always remember if consonants appear the first characters in the word, there is a vowel omitted before or after the same can be easily found from the past or following sentence.

HAVE YOU MASTERED THE FOREGOING LESSONS?

If you have, now you can practice for speed. **Be sure to write the sound only**, and memorize the rules thoroughly.

The Word Signs should be recited daily.
