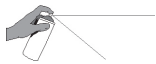

Head of UC Berkeley's "Operation Excellence" Goes on Year-long Vacation

University of California (UC) administrators acknowledged recently that Al Pisano, head of the "Operational Excellence" initiative aimed at cutting excess costs, was resigning to go on a year-long vacation.

Financial Crisis Was Both Avoidable and Inevitable, Commission Inquiry Finds

WASHINGTON – The 2008 financial crisis was both avoidable and inevitable, concluded a ten member commission after interviewing over 700 witnesses and releasing a 576-page book of investigative findings with cunning illustrations.

“No one could have seen this coming,” the panel wrote in the report’s conclusions, “except the people who could have seen this coming. And it will never happen again until it happens again.”

The commission, populated by both Democrats and Republicans, blames regulation failures, corporate mismanagement, the Federal Reserve, heedless risk-taking by investors and lenders, Wall Street, Disneyland, Britney Spears, those little stickers they put on your fruit these days, critical mass bicyclists, and climate change for the financial disaster which shook the world.

THE COMMISSION’S REPORT states clearly that Alan Greenspan, right, who was personally insulted by the very concept of regulation and who led the central bank as the housing bubble expanded, and his successor, Ben S. Bernanke, who did not see the crisis coming because everybody was making money hand over foot which was the whole point, are a couple of clowns who have no idea what they’re talking about.

The report acknowledges that the financial industry spent \$2.7 billion on lobbying from 1999 to 2008, and that individuals and committees affiliated with it made more than \$1 billion in campaign contributions, but dismissed these factors as playing much of a role.

“It isn’t like ordinary folks, people without \$2.7 billion, can’t email their congressional representatives, too,” stated Republican committee member Peter J. Wallison. “Stifling free speech is not the answer.”

For every approximately \$40 in assets,

the nation’s five largest investment banks had only \$1 in capital to cover their losses, meaning that a 3 percent drop in asset values could have wiped them out. The banks’ vulnerability was hidden by using derivatives, off-balance-sheet entities, little fuzzy puppets, fireworks displays, and complex Secret Santa games.

“And alcohol,” added another committee member. “A lot of top-quality alcohol.”

The report should be a best-seller according to the commission’s chairman, Phil Angelides, because it is dotted with literary flourishes and well-known paraphrases from Shakespeare.

“It has greed, corruption, moral dissolution, corporate myopia, pathos, and more risks than the Xtreme Games,” stated Angelides. “And all without disturbing the current regulations one little bit. We think it will sell really well.”

The public is encouraged to search thoroughly through their own paperwork in case the pipeline papers just accidentally got mixed up with them while they were sorting through their bills.

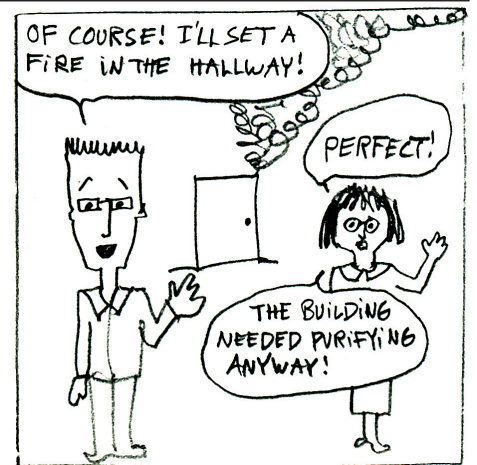
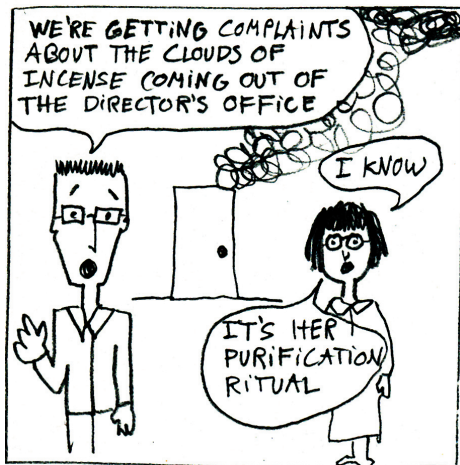

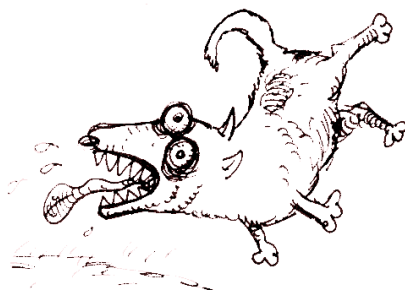
