

Standardised Death Rate – Preventable (Preventable Mortality)

In 2015-19, the standardised death rate due to preventable mortality stood at 208 deaths per 100,000 population, this is not a statistically significant change from the 2010-14 baseline, and no clear and consistent trend was observed over the period.

Overall, this represents **no change** for this indicator from the baseline year.



Age Standardised Preventable Death Rate

Methodology for assessing change: A change in the preventable mortality rate over time requires a statistically significant change in the NI rate to be observed or a clear and consistent trend over 4 or more years.
